## Tribute To A Great Man

One of our most important South African community members, J.J. Naude, passed away on April 8th, 2002. J.J. succumbed quietly in his sleep that Monday morning. Although he had been battling diabetes for many years it was a Godsend that he was able to slip away so peacefully.

All of us in his extended South African family join the Naude family in mourning the passing of a truly great man.

J.J. is survived by Noleen, his wife of 32 years, and sons Nico, Philip and Chris (all living here in the U.S.), and Tertius, still living in South Africa.

This much-cherished patriarch was an excellent provider whose deep love and dedication for family drove him to achieve a brighter horizon and long term security. In the decade prior to bringing the family to America, J.J. did all he could to prepare them for the "big jump." Noleen told me recently how J.J. had often expressed the importance that she be completely ready for the move. "He'd tease that, otherwise, I'd make his life hell, she remem-

bers fondly." With characteristic good humor, she added that, "I made his life hell anyway."

Those of us who knew him well understand that exactly the opposite is true. As his love and inspiration, Noleen brought great joy to J.J.'s life. Together, they raised three wonderful sons of whom J.J. was most proud.

J.J. found great pleasure and solitude in tending his garden. He also loved antiques, both collecting and restoring. In particular he loved fixing



## The Wanderlust Bug Bites Again

Joan and Tim O'Toole left St. Petersburg recently, setting sail for the first leg of a long journey to Central America. In the process of readying their boat KONA for this adventure, they spent more than five months living in a dusty, dirty yacht work yard. Each and every day of the job was hard and unpleasant, but they were determined to not only get it done, but to get it done right. It was worth the effort. KONA looks great again and Joan and Tim are securely off on another great adventure.

While undertaking the work in St. Petersburg, their task was massive due to a good deal of gel-coat blistering on the KONA. By the time they'd completed the job, they'd applied six layers of epoxy over the 'faired' bottom and another three layers of top-grade copper-bottom paint. They then spray-painted the topside with three layers of hard marine paint, masked the hull and sprayed the boot stripe. Those were the top three of the larger tasks that needed to be completed for their launch as KONA has had a good hammering since being launched in Durban, some 10,000 miles and four-and-a-half years ago. There are many more jobs that still need to be done.

KONA is presently in the Florida coastal islands, under anchor. There, close friends are helping to complete last minute chores on the boat. Joan and Tim are enjoying their current rent-free status and are happy to be free of the dreaded 'window envelopes' that arrive in the post. Their cars have been sold and returned; the jobs they held while here have gone to others who need the work. Soon they will return their cell phone to the supplier, leaving them with Internet Email as their only form of contact. No email has been installed from KONA as Joan and Tim say they prefer to locate shore-based Internet Cafés when possible.

While traveling south by west, they will continue to work on restoring and painting the deck before the intense heat and tropical rain begins, forcing a change of plan. There is also new woodwork to be completed in the interior. One plan is to be in Panama by August of this year and then spend another four-plus months in the islands. From there, they will plan day-by-day. They say they expect to 'get stuck in' while in Panama's tropical islands which, according to Joan, "will be our hurricane secure area."


Reflecting on the time they spent in Florida, Joan and Tim

say they were befriended by many wonderful families. "We owe them so much for always giving help and happiness as well as so many 'over the top' dinners," Joan said, "Though it didn't help our bulging center lines."

After some serious time of being away, sailing thousands of sea miles, and visiting endless islands, they plan to return to Florida. But that plan is far, far away. For now, they are pacing themselves, working on the day to day 'job jar' routine, readying KONA to get under sail, en route to Mexico.





# Don't Let Your Computer Get Hijacked.

The Internet has given us the freedom to explore and share information on a scale never before seen. It offers many opportunities and can be a great asset. Some companies have taken advantage of this new frontier, for their own benefit. We as travelers on the information superhighway are valuable because we are potential customers to companies selling their wares online. A new term has emerged from this new era that few are familiar with: Spyware.

Spyware as the name suggests is a program that monitors your online activity and reports what it records back to a database. Spyware is also called Adware. Some software producers place these small programs in certain Shareware software to try to sell the information gathered to companies who want to know where you go and what you do online. These companies then in turn sell that information to marketing firms. They feel that because they give the software away for free they should be allowed to monitor your activity.

I do not subscribe to this policy. Unfortunately legislation has not yet caught up with this trend. As of yet, Spyware is still legal only because it has not yet got the attention of lawmakers. There is a light at the end of the tunnel though. A German group of programmers called Lavasoft are fight-

ing back against Spyware. They have written a program that swiftly identi-



fies and removes Spyware. This program is called Ad-Aware and can be downloaded here: <http://download.cnet.com/downloads/0-10106-108-63806.html>. You can also get a list of most of the known Spyware here: <http://www.tom-cat.com/spybase/spylist.html>.

The most recent Spyware incident involves a very popular file-sharing program called Kazaa. File sharing is similar to Napster in that it shares files between individual users, except Kazaa shares all types of files including pictures, movies and programs. The Spyware that installs with Kazaa goes beyond what ordinary Spyware does. This software (by Brilliant software) will connect with the same Spyware on other computers to form its own network using your computer's processing power, bandwidth and storage. ## Dr. Seuss Explains Why Computers Sometimes Crash:


If a packet hits a pocket on a socket on a port,

## Life Act 245(i) Update

Well folks, its that time again. Media outlets are reporting passage of an extension to Section 245(i) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, and it is generating some misleading rumors throughout the immigrant community. This article will briefly discuss where that extension stands as of this writing, and what it does and does not mean.

First, let's talk about what 245(i) is not. It is not an amnesty. I know some media are reporting it as an amnesty, but trust me, it is not. It does not allow everyone who entered the country illegally, or who overstayed their visas to get a "green card," no matter how long they have been in the U.S. It is also not a "new" law. Section 245(i) has been in place for over ten years, in one form or another. The deadline for filing under the section originally passed in 1996.

Then, on Dec. 21, 2000, President Clinton signed the L.I.F.E. Act, which extended that deadline until April 30, 2001. As explained below, as of this writing that deadline still stands.

So what does Section 245(i) do? Its purpose is to allow some aliens who would normally not be eligible to adjust their status to permanent residence to do so by paying a penalty of \$1,000.00 and filing another form. The trick is that those aliens must be otherwise eligible to adjust. The law does not create a separate class of aliens who can adjust their status, only helps those who would be able to if they hadn't entered illegally or over-

stayed their visas. That means that the only people who can utilize 245(i) to adjust their status are the Immediate Relatives of U.S. Citizens, Preference Relatives who have current priority dates, or beneficiaries of an approved Labor Certification. Further, to be eligible for adjustment, the Labor Certification or I-130 Petition for Alien Relative must have been filed before April 30, 2001, and the alien must have been present in the United States on Dec. 21, 2000. It also applies only to people who entered without inspection or who overstayed their visas, not to people who entered fraudulently.

(Like someone who used a passport not in his or her name.)

As of this writing, there has not been an extension of section 245(i) benefits. There has been a version of a bill regarding 245(i) passed by both the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives. These bills are currently being reconciled between the two houses of Congress.

That is, the two houses have to come up with a single version of the bill to send to the President.

Once that is done, President Bush must sign the bill into law. Then, the Immigration and Naturalization Service will have to implement regulations in order to allow people to file under the new extension. Therefore, it is not going to happen in the next half-hour. It may be weeks or months before a person could practically file under section 245(i). (If the person is not already qualified.)

We do not know yet what the final language of the bill will

## A Personal Update

Since so many of you have been asking and wondering how I'm doing, I'd like to take this opportunity to fill you all in.

As many of you know, I was diagnosed with breast cancer on September 11th, last year. Yeah, *that* September 11th!

Since then I have had two surgeries and completed five out of eight chemo treatments. These should be finished by the end of May. After that, there will be a series of radiation treatments followed by some drug therapy for the next five years. It seems that they don't consider the cancer to be safely in remission until that five-year stretch has been completed.

"Whew!" A lot of you may be thinking by now. But let me say that the most important thing in this for me, has been the incredible moral support that I have received from friends and colleagues, both old and new. Letters, cards and emails still arrive today. I feel most blessed to be a part of this wonderful South African community, yet also to be living in the Tampa Bay area, where I have made many true friends.

I had decided shortly after being diagnosed that this journey would be an opportunity for spiritual growth, not just for myself but for those around me as well. Andy reminded me the other day about a Ray Wylie Hubbard song that goes... "some get spiritual because they've seen the light, and others 'cause they feel the heat." Well I must admit that this has certainly reinforced my faith, and drawn me much closer to God, while giving me a whole new perspective on life. The many prayers that have been generated on my behalf are definitely working because I know I would not have had the strength to do this on my own. I shall be eternally grateful to those close friends and family who have been pillars of support and strength throughout this time.

Of the eight chemotherapy sessions that the doctor prescribed,

the first four went relatively well. I began the second phase recently, and to put it in true American fashion, "it kicked my butt". This stuff was different from the first and my reaction to it was nasty. I have since spoken to my doctor who has agreed to alter the medication in an effort to reduce the side effects. My next session is on Thursday, April 18. Hopefully this will be milder.

At present, I have put my business up for sale so that I can concentrate on getting well and then I would like to do something positive for the breast cancer cause. Which brings to mind: ladies... when last did you go for a mammogram? Do me one other favor, please. If you have been for one recently, or are getting ready to go and have one done, make it a point of talking to at least three other women. You can tell them my story if you think it will help motivate them to get their mammograms done. A most important thing to remember though, is that you must **never put it off because of finances**. (Like I did) There are programs in place around here that will take care of it for you. In Pinellas County, we have the Mammogram Voucher Program (*that saved my life*). All you need to qualify, is to be over 40, not have health insurance, and be a resident of Pinellas. I'm not sure what the case is in Hillsborough or Pasco counties, or elsewhere around the country for that matter, but Gina at the program will be more than willing to help. Her phone number is (727) 812-7021. She is located at the American Cancer Society in Pinellas Park, off 49th Street. You will need to see a doctor and get a referral for a mammogram, but then the program will kick in, and it won't cost you a dime. *Yes! There is a God!* If you're uncertain, or have any questions at all, please contact me, (727) 502-0867.

While it appears that I'm in it for the long haul, I know that with the friends and support that I have, *I can do it*. Thank you all so much, once again. You have been awesome!

be. It may place further restrictions on the filing of petitions under 245(i), such as that the "relationship" used to file must have existed before April 30, 2001. It may raise the penalty for filing above the current \$1,000.00. It may do many things. What it will not do, however, is grant a general amnesty. If you think you may qualify for adjustment of status under section 245(i), the best thing to do is call an immigration attorney who can look at the facts of your specific case and determine if you do. If you have not had a petition filed for you on or before April 30, 2001, however, you will have to wait until the President signs this extension into law to determine what this extension will mean.

## Renewal of Driver's License Laws Now In Effect

Some new laws pertaining to the renewal of driver's licenses are now in effect. One of the people in our SA group recently had to renew his license and went along to the DMV office on US19 in St. Pete.

He was told that he could not renew his license there since he is a foreigner and that he had to go to the office at 6855 62nd Ave. N., in Pinellas Park. This is only office in Pinellas County that will handle the renewal of drivers licenses for foreigners. Please call ahead and establish where you need to go in your county, prior to embarking on this venture.

You will need to take along all documented proof of your legal status. eg. Alien Registration Receipt Card, Employment Authorization Card or your I-94 together with your passport.

You can expect to have your photograph taken and your current licence taken away. You will then be issued a paper licence, valid for 30 days while you wait for a new one to be mailed from Tallahassee. This new licence will be valid only up until your work permit or visa expires. It is recommended that you make an appointment, call 547-7684.

# Bill Lets Illegals Seek Residency

## FOREIGNERS CAN STAY AS PAPERWORK DONE

WASHINGTON — The House approved legislation Tuesday that would allow thousands of foreigners to seek legal residency in the United States, even though they are in the country illegally.

The 275-137 vote handed President Bush, an advocate of the measure, a victory he can tout as a sign of U.S. goodwill toward immigrants when he travels to Latin America next week.

It was a defeat for lawmakers, mostly Republicans, who favor restricting immigration.

The measure, considered under rules that required a two-thirds majority for passage, cleared the House by the barest of margins. A one-vote switch would have defeated it.

The measure heads to the Senate, which already has given broad bipartisan approval to similar legislation.

Bush praised the House action, saying it will help keep families together and make America a "more welcoming society." He urged the Senate to pass the measure quickly.

The core of the House bill would allow thousands of potential immigrants — most of whom entered the country illegally or overstayed visas — to remain with their families while they complete paperwork to obtain a precious green card entitling them to settle in the United States. To do so, applicants would have to pay a \$1,000 fine.

Without the exemption, the would-be immigrants would be forced to return to their native countries to file an application. Once there, they could be barred from re-entry for up to 10 years, a major disincentive to many of those who would otherwise make a bid to become legal residents.

Last year, a similar four-month program drew 400,000 applicants. Wedding chapels in cities across the country, including Los Angeles, were thronged by people hoping to emerge from the migrant underground.

Some advocates estimate 200,000 or more people could step forward under a renewal of the program, many from Southern California. But others say the numbers this time could be much smaller, in the tens of thousands.

The window of opportunity opened by the measure would be narrow. The provision would apply only to foreigners who had obtained a qualifying sponsor — through employment with a U.S. company, for example, or marriage to a U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident — before Aug. 15, 2001. They would have until Nov. 30 of this year to apply for an adjustment of their immigration status.

Then the measure would end.

Cecilia Munoz, vice president of the National Council of La Raza, a Latino rights group, said: "It's an incredibly modest proposal which doesn't ultimately help very many people. In some ways, it's more symbolically important than substantively important."


