

We tried to be practical and to consider all angles, but kept returning to the fact that this Aunt had flown here two years ago , unaccompanied, to visit us -- so surely the least we could do would be to present ourselves at her 90th birthday celebration.

So it was, that we spent two weeks in Durban last month. Preferring to be near my Aunt, it was helpful when there was a cancellation on the guest-room at her retirement home -- for exactly our dates!!

Not only does my Aunt have a car and drive around town, but a cousin made herself and her car available, and was wonderful about taking us out of town.

That way we spent a memorable day exploring the North Coast, passing the new soccer stadium and Shaka Airport, and the hill-top casino and rolling sugar cane fields. Morning coffee on the terrace at The Oyster Box Hotel at Umhlanga (now a Red Carnation elite hotel) was like a fairytale --and a good remedy for jetlag.

Should you drive further north, be sure to turn off at the sign for “The Pottery Gallery” (near Zimbali). Firstly, you’ll be greeted by free-roaming animals and local monkeys, then focus on the pottery and watch it being made. I’m not a shopper, but brought home a bowl decorated with a guinea fowl feather design , and our Aussie friend has taken colorful plates back to Sydney. One can have a light lunch there

or mango smoothies,etc.

Another day, we were taken inland towards the misty,cooler Valley of a Thousand Hills, where we spent some hours at Makarenga Garden Lodge at Kloof. Do plan to have lunch on the terrace, besides seeing the garden either on foot or from a golfcart.This 30-acre garden, started in 1976, specializes in orchids and

bromeliads, but has much else besides.

As our visit was short, we passed on going to Hluhluwe Game Reserve (Zululand). Instead, we happily accepted an offer of a one-day visit to the nearer,smaller,

privately-owned Tala Game Reserve. There we saw several giraffes (including youngsters), rhinos, zebra, wildebeest, blesbok, impalas, warthogs, hippos, an ostrich family and various other birds. They don’t have elephants or big cats, but we were satisfied, and soon recovered from the bouncy jeep ride!! Tala’s buffet lunch is excellent.

So, all together it was worth the long journey (over 30 hrs on three planes each way), and was a good time to see many of my extended family together. Some had flown from the Rand, and some even from Zimbabwe. Clearly, this is a favorite Aunt -- the youngest (and last) of her generation. And we’ll gladly do it all over again for her 100th!!

Kulula

Kulula is an Airline with head office situated in Johannesburg. Their airline attendants make an effort to make the in-flight “safety lecture” and announcements a bit more entertaining. Here are some actual examples that have been heard or reported:
